## Supply List 2012/2013



### Welcome To Third Grade!

Greetings from your teachers! We are looking forward to many special and exciting experiences with your child. They will be challenged in many ways.

In Math we review our basic facts in addition and subtraction, then quickly progress to renaming with larger digits, place value, measurement, multiplication and division with a strong emphasis on problem solving.

Your student will receive instruction in the literature-based Macmillian-McGraw Hill Reading Series on the Third Grade level.

Trips will be taken from the bottom of the sea to the farthest planet and around the globe, learning about communities. (We'll also take some field trips in the Delaware Valley.)

The Homework Assignment Book (HAB) will be sent home daily for you to check assignments and *sign* when they are complete. Please be sure to review it with your child and sign the contract in the front of the book. The HAB is a source of communication between parent, child and teachers and helps develop organizational skills. We suggest that you and your child plan a certain time each day to review homework and sign the book when the work is completed.

The following supplies will be needed for each student: a box of 12 #2 pencils (these will be collected and given out on an as needed basis throughout the year), crayons (no larger than 24), 2 glue sticks, a pair of scissors, 3 – 4 eraser caps for pencil tops, two composition notebooks (black and white marbled cover), a regular spiral notebook, 4 solid colored pocket folders in the following colors: (1) green, (1) blue, (1) yellow and (1) red, and one additional folder of your choice which will be used for Book-It reports. Please send in only what your child needs. All extra supplies can be kept at home and sent in on an "as needed" basis. Student desks are not large enough to accommodate Trapper Keepers or 3-ring binders, so students are asked not to bring them to school. We also ask that students avoid bringing pencils, erasers and school supplies that resemble toys. These things create a distraction for students and interrupt the learning environment.

Let's work together to make 2012-2013 a great year!!

### Welcome to Fourth Grade!

Fourth grade is an exciting year, full of scientific explorations and history, problem solving and writing, and language and literature. Learn about our state, possibly make a county cake, and visit with a meteorologist. Or you may be transported back in time to colonial America to learn what children did then. In fourth grade, the possibilities are endless.

Fourth grade will also be a challenge. You are expected to: 1) have your addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division **facts through 12 memorized** for September (Purchasing your own flashcards for these four operations would help your child greatly for reinforcement of daily math work.); 2) **do your homework** and turn it in **on time each day**; 3) be as enthusiastic about your learning as we are.

You may be doing most of your work in cursive, and you will be changing classes for some things. You will continue using the ***Homework Assignment Book***. Remember to show it to your parents (along with your homework) each day and have them sign the book when your work is completed.

The following supplies are needed when you come in September:

- 1 1/2" ring binder to hold your HAB
- 2 single subject ***spiral*** notebooks will be needed for Language Arts
- Pencils
- Crayons (no more than 24)
- Blue pen
- Glue sticks, eraser tips, and especially scissors
- Pack of colored pencils (at least 12)
- One composition book (black and white marbled cover)
- **1 Pocket Folder and a pack of wirebound index cards for Spanish Class**

You may find that your specific teacher will require a few more supplies. Please do not buy sticky book covers, as they are very difficult to remove from the books in June. Please **do not buy book socks before you see the books**, as some socks break the bindings of the bigger books. Although children may supply their own paper for some homework assignments, **please do not buy a Trapper Keeper or large 3-ring binder** for your child. Unfortunately, we will have to send them home since they do **not** fit into the desks.

- #2 Pencils (**PLEASE NO MECHANICAL PENCILS**)
- Erasers
- 2 pens (**PLEASE NO BLACK INK**)
- 2 highlighters
- Colored Pencils or Crayons
- Glue Stick
- Three-hole-punched loose leaf paper
- A 1" Binder for the Homework Book, Homework Folder, and pencil case
- Three 1" Binders for Math, Literacy, Science/Social Studies
- A flash drive for Computer class (4MB or larger)
- 1 Pocket Folder and wire-bound index cards for Spanish Class
- 1 Marble Composition Book (for Literacy)
- 1 Single subject Spiral Notebook for Music Class
- 1 Single subject Spiral Notebook with holes for Math
- 2 packages of 5 insertable dividers for binders
- 2 Pocket Folders (Science/Social Studies)

*\*\* (If they are any bigger than 1", they will not fit in the desks.)*

**\*\* NO TRAPPER KEEPERS OR ZIPPERED BINDERS. THEY ARE TOO BIG! THEY WILL BE SENT HOME.**

*Dividers with plastic tabs (approximately 20 sheets, not packages. This will allow for about five dividers for each subject)*

*3 red pens*

*6 sharpened pencils (with erasers) to be replenished throughout the year pencil case*

*loose-leaf paper (needed throughout the year)*

*3 Spiral Bound Notebooks (two for Math and one for Music) (70-100 sheets will be fine)*

*2 Hard Cover Composition Books - different colors (Math)*

*2 Hard Cover Composition Books - different colors (Literacy)*

*Texas Instrument TI-30 scientific calculator (Preferably XIIS)*

*2-two pocket folders with the three ring centers (Spanish & Art)*

*Pack of wirebound index cards for Spanish Class*

*One pack of wire bound index cards (Spanish)*

*Crayons, colored pencils or thin markers*

*1 pack of dry erase markers (Math)*

*3-4 packs of 3x5 index cards (S.S.)*

*Pack of 5 highlighters (Literacy & S.S.)*

*Loose-leaf reinforcements*

*Eraser heads*

*Flash Drive 4 MB or larger (Computer Class & Literacy)*
