General Music

In music we jumped right into learning at the start of September! I was very excited to see all of the returning students and welcome new third graders into my classroom.

<u>Third grade</u> began by reviewing the basics! By doing so, we start learning the story of "Music Street," created by Lorna Zemke that takes the entire year to complete. The story helps students learn solfege pitches and melodic terminology in a sequential manner. The kids love it! With this, we have already learned a few melodic solfege syllables, basic rhythm values, completed a rhythmic composition and performed them on body percussion!

<u>Fourth grade</u> is all about learning the recorder! The beginning of the year is all about music notation preparation. We started off with reviewing basic rhythm values from last year. The students created an eight measure rhythmic composition that was performed in small groups using body percussion. Now we have moved on to learning music symbols and notation that they will see when they receive music for the recorder in late November.

<u>Fifth grade</u> started off the year learning about instrument families! Since we ended last year with the recorder, I thought it would be nice to begin this year learning about different instruments in the world. We have completed brass and are currently in percussion. Students are participating in a composition project where they compose a melodic and rhythms, transpose it to music notation, and will perform their creations with a partner.

The <u>sixth grade</u> year is completely focused on learning how we have the music we have today. In September we start off in the medieval times and by the end of the year we land in the music of today's generation. Every time we hit a new time period, we start with a lesson and then add an activity that reflects that lesson the following week. Students also write a listening journal, a 5 sentence reflection about a piece that reflects current time period.

Third graders have been busy getting to know GAFE! GAFE stands for Google Apps for Education. Since all of our third grade students have Chromebooks this year, technology class takes place weekly in their homeroom.
