COMING THIS WEEK...

Literacy

a - "apple" - /a/

g - "game" - /g/

In Foundations this week, we will be learning the lowercase formations and sounds for the letters a and g (review t, b, f, m, n, i, c, o, and u). We also will be using sentence frames to practice with sentence structure and counting words in sentences (understanding that words are separated by spaces). We also practice isolating the beginning sounds of words and matching to a letter. Students should be able to match letters to sounds for letters learned thus far. In Journeys', we will be exploring the theme of 'Tools to Help Us' through stories and poems. We will be working with skills such as action verbs, reviewing nouns, synonyms, and beginning sounds. We will be reviewing all of unit 1 sight words. In addition, we will be reading some familiar fairy tales and various versions of them to compare text features, characters, settings, etc. When we read this week, we will focus on the main idea, details, and cause and effect. In writing we will start a new unit for "lists and labels". Students are working on creating pictures with clear details and "5-star" coloring! Last week, we practiced "labeling" our pictures with words or beginning sound letters (matching sounds we hear to a letter).

Unit 1 sight words: I, **one, like, our, day, the, and, off**

Target skills: details, cause and effect, and asking questions. We will also continue recognizing and producing rhyming pairs, summarize stories, writing ideas with pictures/labels, concepts of print, action verbs, letters a and g, pencil grip, writing grid, reading stamina with picture walks using the "eagle eye" strategy.

Math

We will begin Chapter 3 this week which will introduce students to numbers 6-9. We will practice counting, recognizing, showing, and writing each number. This chapter will also give practice with problem solving as well as review greater than and less than strategies when we compare numbers 1-9. Please see the vocabulary cards we will send home on Monday to practice throughout the chapter.

TIPS AND TRICKS

- Each night - recite the alphabet, practice counting above 10, write your name.
- Optional: Begin making a sight word box. Each week when we learn new words, add them to a box and pick out a few each night to practice. (shoe box, wipes container, index cards). Ask students to come up with rhyming words as well.
- Password Game: Choose different letters, numbers, and sight words to make as “passwords” to different rooms in the house. Every time the students want to enter the room, ask for the password :-)
