Arrival/Dismissal Safety Reminders

To keep our students safe, please review the following important reminders:

Drop-Off in Designated Areas Only

Student drop-off should only take place at Door 2 or Door 4. Some families have been stopping in the lanes where our preschool buses unload in front of the building. This creates a dangerous situation for our youngest students. Please use the designated areas only.

Drive Slowly Through the Lanes

Preschool buses unload in front of the building, and students are walking in these areas. Driving too quickly poses a serious safety risk. Please slow down and proceed with caution at all times.

Supervise Your Child After Pickup

At dismissal, once you have picked up your child, please do not linger outside the building. Children should not be running around the property. All students must be supervised by their parent/guardian once dismissed.

All of our students eat snack during the day. Please plan on sending a nut-free snack each day with your child.




School lunch can be purchased for \$3.50. Feel free to set up your My School Bucks account to pay for your lunch online!

One Book One School

This month's One Book, One School story, The Bad Seed, reminds us that respect is something we can learn, practice, and share with others. Just as the seed discovers how to make better choices, our Hornets grow when families and schools work together with respect at the center. Together, we are building a community where every child feels valued and supported.





October's Focus

Book: The Bad Seed Trait: Respect

- Home Connection Ideas
 - Respect Pledge Together: Create a short 'Respect Pledge' as a family (e.g., "I will use kind words, listen to others, and take care of my things."). Post it somewhere everyone can see.
 - Respect Role-Play: Act out little scenarios: What if someone interrupts? What if you spill milk? What if a friend is sad? Practice the respectful way to respond.
 - Respect Bingo: Make a simple Respect Bingo board at home. Each square can say things like: "I said thank you," "I took turns," "I helped clean up," "I listened the first time," "I used kind words." Each time your child does one, mark it off. Aim for 'Bingo' by the end of the week and celebrate with a fun family activity!
 - Respect Seed Planting: Plant real seeds together. Talk about how respect grows when we care for others and ourselves, just like the seed grows when it's watered and cared for.
 - Family Talk Prompt: At dinner or bedtime, talk about this: "In The Bad Seed, the seed learned he could change and show respect. What's one way we can show more respect to each other at home?"
