Week of Respect

In addition, winning tables are charted and displayed weekly via a smiley face bar graph at Clark and a bulletin board featuring group photos of the winning tables at Mickle. The program has created a positive atmosphere in which our students try their best to show respect, politeness, and responsibility during lunch every day. A special thank you to Mrs. Benedetto, for creating our Golden Trays, and our Supervisory Aides for their assistance.

Individually Unique, Together Complete!

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Recycling Challenge

In an effort to promote awareness and encourage our students to protect the environment, The Recycling Challenge was introduced by Mr. Agar, one of our Supervisory Aides at Mickle. Students are encouraged to place their recyclables into a plastic bin and at the end of each lunch, Mr. Agar tallies up the number of recyclables for each grade level. The totals for the month are logged and on the last day of month, the winning grade level is announced. As a reward, the winning grade level receives a trophy made out of recyclables to be displayed in their classrooms throughout the month, a half sheet of Buzz Bucks, and additional recess. Our 3rd graders were recognized as the Recycling Challenge winners in October, recycling a total of 814 plastic bottles. Our 4th graders were recognized as the Recycling Challenge winner in November and December, collecting a total of 1,115 in November and 925 plastic bottles in December. As a school, we have recycled 8.400 plastic **bottles** since the middle of October. We appreciate our students' effort to make a difference and look forward to seeing how many plastic bottles we are able to recycle this year!
