Hi Parents! We began this year diving right into a jam-packed, yet meaningful curriculum. Here is what we have done and are about to do:

- <u>3rd Grade</u>: Students have started off the year learning the beginnings of the Do Pentatonic scale! This is a five-note scale, and we have already mastered two of those notes and just began to learn the third. We have worked on sight singing, aural skills, notation, as well as composition on xylophones!
- 4th Grade: We began this year jumping right into learning the notes on the staff in preparation for the recorder. Students will begin learning how to play the recorder soon. Stay tuned for information regarding our recorder concert in April!
- <u>5th Grade</u>: Instrument families have been the focus since the beginning of the year. We have learned instrument timbres, construction, orchestra facts, and the physics of their sounds. Right now the fifth graders are working on a composition project utilizing pitched and non-pitched percussion instruments. This project is very complex but fun! Students are working in groups to compose duet pieces and will play them on percussion instruments for the class.
- 6th Grade: Sixth grade has started this year learning about the origins of music! We started off in the Medieval period and learned the beginnings of music notation, how we came up with a "scale" and the first original instruments to ever exist. Since then, we have learned about the Renaissance, Baroque, and Classical periods. We will continue into the Romantic and Impressionist periods before continuing into the Modern era. Our goal is to find out how we got to where we are today.

SPANISH CLASS ¿Qué pasa? What's happening?

Hola Parents! This school year we kicked off by celebrating Hispanic Heritage Month, September 15 through October 15. Students in all grades learned the names of the countries where Spanish is spoken, through music. We also learned about the life of César Chávez, a Mexican American civil rights leader. Third and fourth grades enjoyed an art class during Spanish and had the opportunity to paint the flag of a Spanish speaking country.

In October, I had the opportunity to see many of our *familias* and *estudiantes* during our Multicultural Night. This event was a wonderful way to meet many members of our school family and celebrate our diverse community. It was my pleasure to prepare one of my family's favorite foods, Spanish rice. Currently students are working on their conversational Spanish. We are focusing on asking others how they feel (¿Cómo estás?) and expressing our emotions. We love learning through play. In class we often use vocabulary games to help us review. Most recently the students have been using puppets to practice their mini-conversations! STRINGS MUSIC

Strings lessons have been going well; we are learning about reading musical notation and being able to do this in larger sections.

The strings students are quickly developing their skills as ensemble performers and individual musicians as they work toward caroling and/or the Give a Gift performance.

3rd Grade - Students at this grade level are learning how to be part of their future ensemble - the string orchestra.

Students are being challenged to count out loud and play with the bow together in small and large groups.

4th Grade - Students have started demonstrating accurate playing and building on past skills and continuing to work with the book and to read additional music.

5th Grade - Students have started demonstrating accurate playing and building on past skills and continuing to work with the book, to read additional music and to build advanced skills requiring them to play quickly on all.

6th Grade - Students are modeling advanced skills and continue to play and build on past skills including low 2nd finger vs. high 2nd finger and music theory. We are also continuing to work with the book, to read additional music and to develop these advanced skills.

The 5th and 6th grade groups rehearse once per cycle and we are focusing on learning newer and more advanced material.

5th & 6th Grade Strings Ensemble students will perform during "Give a Gift Night" on December 5th.

INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC (Band)

The **5th Grade Band** is off to a great start this year! After two months of lessons and our first(!) rehearsals, the students are beginning to master the fundamentals of sound production and note reading, along with learning how to play as an ensemble. For the rest of the school year, the 5th graders will have one lesson and two rehearsals (Mon/Thu after school) per week.

Students are encouraged to practice every day (minimum 100 minutes per week), referring to their practice charts in the back of the lesson book. Parents should sign the practice chart before each lesson.

I look forward to a great first year with the 5th Grade Band, culminating in the Spring Concert on May 28!

The **6th Grade Band** has been on a roll so far this year. They are working hard in their lessons and at rehearsals (Wed/Fri after school) in preparation for the Winter Concert on December 19th. They will also be performing two concerts for the school during the morning of December 12th.

It is very important that all 6th grade band members practice consistently at home (minimum 100 minutes per week) in these final weeks leading up to the concerts.

Spring 2020 will be an exciting time for the 6th grade band, with the Spring Concert in May and the Six Flags Performance Festival in June!
