Hi Parents! Look at what your children have accomplished, and are preparing to do in music class!!

- <u>3rd Grade</u>: Students have continued the year learning about the Do Pentatonic scale! This is a five-note scale, and we have mastered all five of those notes. We have worked on sight singing, aural skills, notation, as well as composition on xylophone.
- 4th Grade: Students are learning about the recorder. They have learned proper care, how to hold the recorder, and have learned several notes in order to play songs. They are continuing to learn about proper air control. Students earn "belts" in Recorder Karate by playing songs for the teacher. Students will be playing a concert coming up on April 1. All are invited to attend!!
- <u>5th Grade</u>: Students are learning how to become better musicians by way of Bucket Drumming. Students receive a bucket drum, learn proper stick techniques, and drum to various genres of music. Students dissect a piece of music, and tell the teacher what is to be played, what beats they are played on, and how to play correctly.
- <u>6th Grade</u>: Sixth grade has started this year learning about the origins of music! We started off in the Medieval period and learned the beginnings of music notation, how we came up with a "scale" and the first original instruments to ever exist. Since then, we have learned about the Medieval through the Romantic periods. Students are now preparing to compose their own rhythms to perform.

SPANISH CLASS ¿Qué pasa? What's happening?

Feliz Año Nuevo! Happy New Year! We started the 2nd trimester by incorporating the Zones of Regulation, a district approved, cognitive-behavioral approach that has the students asking themselves, ¿Cómo estás? (How are you?). They're practicing answering with Estoy feliz, Estoy mal, Estoy cansado and more, and then regulating their feelings through self-selected mindfulness activities (like stretching,mindful breathing, doodling, quiet time, and more). ¡ Muy bien, clase! En diciembre, we learned about Christmas holiday traditions throughout the Spanish speaking world. As we turned the page to 2020 we have started our World Travelers Unit focusing on basic conversational topics. Our boys and girls are enjoying creating a pasaporte, that they will get to stamp as they memorize useful conversational questions and responses.

Highlighting Black History Month, our students will learn about the life and music of Afro-Cuban super-star and Queen of Salsa, Celia Cruz. Her inspirational journey reminds us to follow our dreams, no matter the challenges and setbacks we face. "Raised in a humble home, the queen of Salsa was nothing but rich with charisma! Celia Cruz was one of those artists you stumble upon once in a blue moon, full of joy. Through the good and the bad,she was always displaying a good attitude and "La Vida Es Un Carnaval" is a perfect song that depicts her attitude towards life. STRINGS MUSIC

During strings lessons, we are increasing the students' ability to play longer pieces of music together as duets. The strings students are quickly developing their skills as ensemble performers and individual musicians as they work toward caroling and/or the String Performance during Arts night.

3rd Grade - Students at this grade level are working on reading new music more frequently and they are working on sound projection and parts of the string that will help them produce louder and quieter sounds.

4th Grade - Students are making a lot of progress with reading, as well as with new bow techniques that will allow for us to have a variety of different sounds we can produce with the instrument. They are also becoming more familiar with the other strings and when to use the 4th finger vs the open string.

5th Grade - Students are learning a great deal of music theory and notes on the G string, which features lots of ledger lines.

6th Grade - Students are modeling advanced skills and techniques, proficiency in reading on all strings, understanding accidentals and key signatures.

The 5th and 6th grade groups rehearse once per cycle and we are focusing on maintaining independence as musicians while we engage in tougher, more challenging music.

All strings students will perform during "Arts Night" on Tuesday, May 19th, 2020.

It is very important that all 6th grade band members practice consistently at home (minimum 100 minutes per week) throughout the winter and spring, working on both the new band music and weekly lesson book assignments.

Exciting things are on the horizon for the 6th grade band, with the Spring Concert on May 28 and the High Note Festival performance (Six Flags) on June 5!
