

Hola Parents! I am excited to have "los estudiantes" back in "la clase de espanol." Over the past few weeks we have been getting used to the classroom routines. The 5th and 6th grades started off the school year with our Hispanic Heritage Month lessons. We have been learning about famous Latinos and about the countries where Spanish is spoken. The 4th graders have been reviewing how to ask and tell others their name, age, and expressing how they are feeling.

Third graders kicked off the school year learning classroom objects and how to express needs ("Yo necesito.."). We also collaborated with Mrs. Benedetto on a Hispanic Heritage Month art project and created "Molas." Molas are hand-made fabric panels that form part of the traditional women's clothing of the indigenous people from Panama.



In the upcoming weeks, students in all grade levels will be learning about the Days of the Dead holiday and practicing basic conversational Spanish, such as how to ask and tell others about their age and birthdate along with things they like.

- ★ I was SO excited to welcome students back into the Library IN-PERSON!!! It has been great to watch students excitedly check out books, show great character, and eager to learn. This year's library theme is "emojis" again because we all have ever-changing feelings right now, but I will continue to focus on all the positives!
- ★ Students are allowed to check out two books every week, but they must return books to get new ones. If a book is lost or damaged, it will need to be replaced, or you can write a check out to Samuel Mickle for the price of the book replacement.
- ★ Students will do all their work during our class time each week and I am here to help everyone. There should be *no stress* in this Library, so if you or your child ever have a question or concern, please reach out to me.
- ★ Throughout every grade level, all students will utilize reading, writing, listening, speaking and technology skills in the Library. I also encourage hands-on, team building maker activities when we have additional time.
- ★ We have hit the ground running! After all our welcome backs, we did grade-level skill assessments, held the book fair and grades four through six are currently writing (*a poem, song, story or play*) to present this week in our Fall/Halloween decorated library.
- ★ Third grade students have been practicing looking up and locating books, and checking out with their own library cards. They also did lessons on book parts, book care, and next week we will discuss what a legend is as we share a story about a local legend together.
- ★ Thank you, thank YOU, THANK YOU! Our Fall Scholastic book fair was the most successful one yet! We had \$18,486 in sales and were able to get thousands of books into the hands of our students. Also we collected \$143 in change and donated it to Klara Pedersen, *Little Miss Wheelchair*, to help her buy more books for local libraries that promote equality and inclusiveness.
- ★ I created a virtual library for students to access any time for read-alouds, writing websites, online magazines, reading lists, coding and online quizzes, Scholastic websites and contests, and more. Hi Parents!

After a year of virtual music class, it is an understatement to say how happy and excited I am to be in the classroom with our students, creating memories, as we continue to work together to learn everything about music! It was wonderful to see our returning students and welcome our new third graders!! Here is a description of what we will be learning in the music classroom for the first trimester:

- 3rd Grade: An intermediate level of instrument families and the physics of sound production within each instrument, basic rhythm notation practice, collaborative composition of basic rhythms, performance, audience etiquette, emotional intent in composition
- 4th Grade: Beginning music theory and reading music on the staff in preparation for the RECORDER!! More information to come.
- 5th Grade: Because the grade-level class did not get to participate in recorder last year due to being virtual, 5th grade students will be doing the same curriculum as 4th grade this year (however, at an appropriate level for their age).
- 6th Grade: A complete analysis of our musical history to understand how we got to having the music in our world today. We started at the beginning where music began. Then as the year progresses, we will move closer and closer to our musical world today. In the first trimester, we will cover the Medieval, Renaissance, Baroque, Classical, and Romantic eras. We will talk about composers, their contributions to the progression and discoveries of music, instruments from each era, and also complete listening journals to analyze how the actual music was composed as it progressed.

Each grade-level will have elements of creating and composition, evaluation and response to music, singing, dancing, music notation, instruments, performing and interpretation, as well as learning about their own individualized connection with music.
