Dear East Greenwich Township School Community,

It is hard to believe we are already into the second month of the school year! Thank you for your support as our students embraced learning new routines and settled into the 2024-2025 school year. This month, I would like to highlight our district's recent positive New Jersey Quality Single Accountability Continuum (NJ QSAC) review and our transition to a new math resource, iReady Math Classroom, in grades Beginners through Five.

New Jersey Quality Single Accountability Continuum (NJ QSAC)

NJ QSAC is a comprehensive assessment of district compliance in five areas: Instruction and Program, Fiscal Management, Governance, Operations and Personnel. The review is conducted by the Gloucester County Executive County Superintendent and a team of professionals. Our district scored at least 80% in each of the five areas, so we will be certified by the NJ State Board of Education as providing a thorough and efficient system of education to our community. We also proudly receive the designation of a "high performing" school district for the next three years, or until the next QSAC review. We recognize and appreciate the hard work of our administration and staff in ensuring our practices and procedures reflect this honor. More information can be found here.

iReady Math Classroom

For the 2024-2025 school year, we adopted iReady Math Classroom in grades Beginners through Five. iReady Classroom shifts the way we provide math instruction, and our new resource has a strong emphasis on meaningful discourse using the Try It, Discuss It, Connect It model. In order to support the transition to a more student-centered, inquiry-based approach to learning math, we must provide time for students to build confidence through meaningful practice and feedback. We believe with frequent, consistent practice, students' skills and discourse stamina will develop.

To provide time for this shift in teaching and learning, for at least the first trimester, grade 1 through 5 students' Math report card grades will be Pass or Fail. Assessments will continue to be given, graded and entered into the gradebook. This provides full transparency for parents and



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students regarding progress and proficiency towards grade level standards. Parents and guardians will be able to view all graded assignment scores and the final grade average. However, the final grade on students' report cards will not be a letter grade such as A, B, C, D or F. Instead, the final grade will be listed as "Pass" or "Fail".

This ensures that a trimester grade is not a barrier to implementing iReady with integrity and fidelity. While we want students to continue to put forth their best efforts, and we want assessment scores to represent students' progress accurately, we do not want students' effort and confidence to be impacted by a shift in how we are teaching and learning math. By also ensuring that math final trimester averages are not included in the calculation of awards or honors, we can reduce the impact of the changing resource and provide space for the learning curve.
