THE SPECIAL EDUCATION PARENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE SERVES AS A MODEL FOR BUILDING THE KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND CONFIDENCE OF PARENTS SEEKING TO GET INVOLVED IN THEIR SCHOOLS AND FACILITATING DEEPER CONNECTIONS BETWEEN FAMILIES AND SCHOOLS. A LOCAL SEPAC GIVES PARENTS THE OPPORTUNITY TO PROVIDE DIRECT INPUT TO THEIR SCHOOL DISTRICT ABOUT PROGRAMS, PRACTICES, AND SERVICES THAT HAVE AN IMPACT ON STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES AND THEIR FAMILIES.

THE EAST GREENWICH TOWNSHIP SPECIAL EDUCATION PARENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE, OR SEPAC, IS A STATE-MANDATED, DISTRICT-LEVEL, PARENT-DRIVEN GROUP THAT PROVIDES INPUT TO THE THE EAST GREENWICH DISTRICT ON SYSTEM-LEVEL CHALLENGES IN SPECIAL EDUCATION AND RELATED SERVICES.

SEPAC IS DESIGNED TO BENEFIT ALL STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES AND IS NOT INTENDED TO BE A FORUM TO DISCUSS AN INDIVIDUAL IEP OR PARTICULAR STUDENT.

SEPAC MEMBERS INCLUDE:

 PARENTS OF CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES WHO MAY HAVE AN INDIVIDUALIZED EDUCATION PROGRAM (IEP) WHO ARE EDUCATED IN SCHOOLS WITHIN OR OUTSIDE THE DISTRICT;
SCHOOL LEADERS, INCLUDING THE CHILD STUDY TEAM SUPERVISOR, MEMBERS OF THE DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION,

CHILD STUDY TEAM MEMBERS AND OTHER SCHOOL PROFESSIONALS; AND ANY PARENT COMMITTED TO IMPROVING EDUCATION IN THE DISTRICT.
