I am writing to provide you information about the 2022-2023 New Jersey School Performance Reports, which were recently released and are available on the NJ School Performance Reports webpage at www.njschooldata.org. You can view a report for our district and both of our schools.

The School Performance Reports reflect the New Jersey Department of Education's (NJDOE) commitment to providing parents, students, and school communities with a large variety of information about each school and district. These reports can be used as a tool to help evaluate whether all students have equitable access to high quality education. We encourage you to use these reports to:

Our schools are a significant source of pride in our community, and this year's School Performance Reports reflect our continued commitment to excellence. Samuel Mickle School received a summative rating based on factors such as proficiency on New Jersey Student Learning Assessments in ELA and math, growth on New Jersey Learning Assessments in ELA and math and chronic absenteeism rates. ***Samuel Mickle School earned an overall summative rating in the 92nd percentile. This means Samuel Mickle School's summative score is equal to or higher than 92% of other elementary schools across the state.***

While Jeffrey Clark School does not receive a summative rating because students in that age range do not take standardized testing, we recognize the success of our students is due to the collaboration and dedication of every staff member, family and community member who work together to provide our students with the very best education, and we all share in this success.

What's New in the 2022-2023 School Performance Reports

The 2022-2023 School Performance Reports include changes that respond to stakeholder feedback, federal and state requirements, and data availability. These changes include:

- **Student growth data** as measured by median student growth percentile for the first time since the 2018-2019 reports;
- Expanded **computer science course participation data** showing participation for all grades kindergarten through 12; and
- Results from the fall 2023 **Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) accountability process**.
