Dear EG Families,



Initially we plan to provide more live, synchronous instruction to our hybrid students on their remote learning days. Over the next few weeks, our upper grade Samuel Mickle students will begin piloting live instruction to hybrid students on their remote learning days, and then this initiative will be expanded downward through the grade levels in the following weeks. 


#Hornets Write On Time Capsule Ceremony
